Noosa Biosphere Awards to celebrate sustainability excellence

The Noosa Biosphere Reserve Foundation (NBRF) has launched a new annual awards program to celebrate environmental and sustainability excellence in the Noosa Shire, with entries now open.

NBRF Executive Coordinator, Sharon Wright says the Noosa Biosphere Awards celebrates the individuals, businesses and organisations implementing local solutions to the global challenges of sustainable development and addressing climate change.

“The Noosa Biosphere Awards are about recognising those making a difference in our community who are championing environmental and sustainability innovation and excellence,” she said.

“Noosa has a strong track record of protecting our precious natural environment and progressing towards a sustainable future. We really want to give everyone the chance to share in this celebration of our community and environment – it’s what makes Noosa a great place to live and visit,” said Ms Wright.

There are four categories covering land, water, wildlife, and people and economy with two categories already securing high profile sponsors.
